

# Make your own spooky mask!

## Method

Choose your material - card, cardboard or heavy weight paper are good options. Choose any colour you'd like and decide what shape you want.

Draw the shape - you can make a mask to cover your eyes, half your face or the entire thing. Decide what shape best fits the character you would like to be and draw it on the material.

Draw eye holes and, if necessary, a mouth hole. To make sure the eye holes are in the right place, first hold the mask in front of your face, then use a pencil to make a small mark on the area in front of your eyes.

We also have downloadable templates ready to print and cut if you would prefer!

With help from a parent or guardian, cut out the mask shape, eye and mouth holes using scissors or a craft scalpel.

Colour your mask with felt tip pens, crayons or paint! Now that you have the shape of your mask, design its base colour.

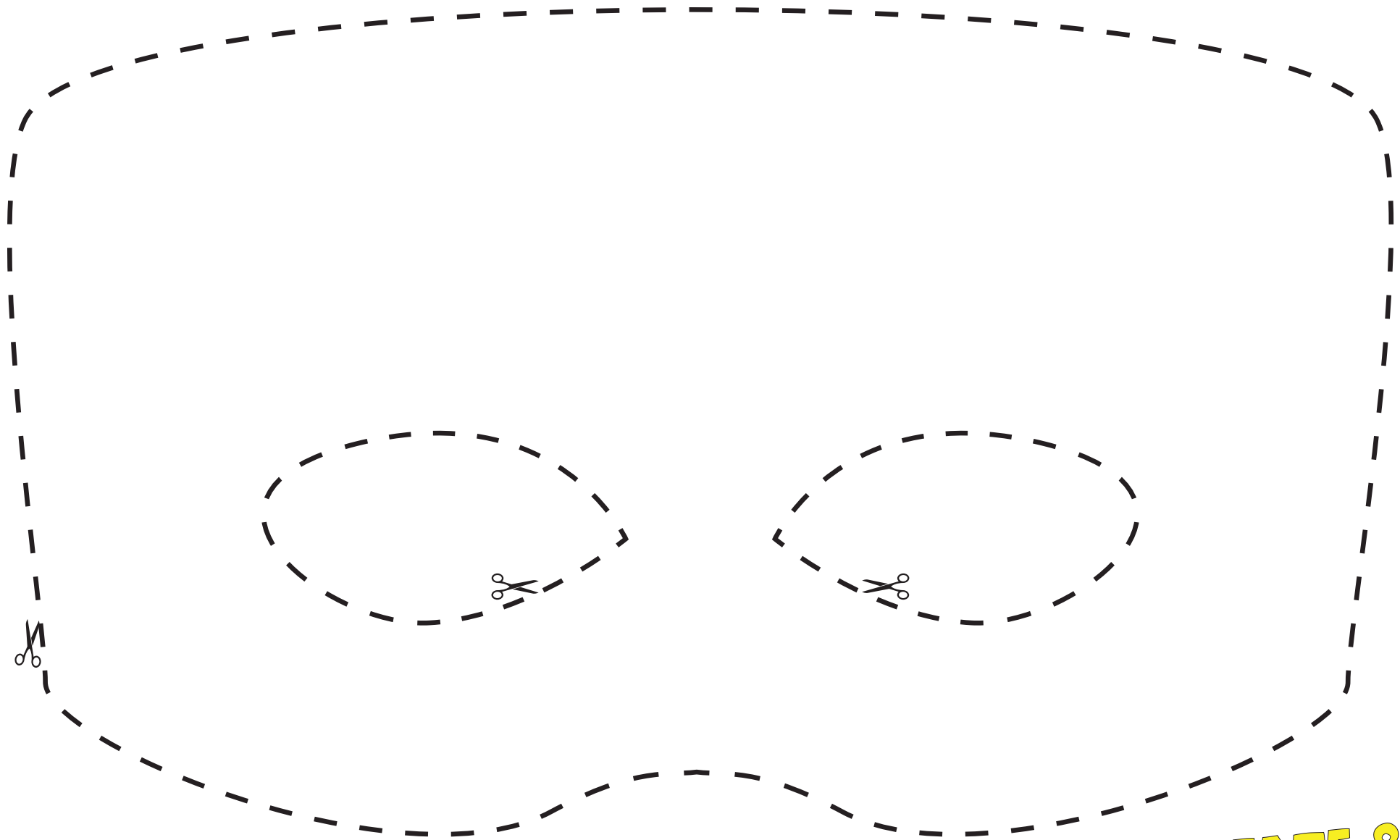
Once you've finished your base layer of colour, glue additional decorations onto your mask to create the character. Felt pieces, glitter, and cut out paper pieces are good choices to add detail to your mask. Let your mask dry completely.

Attach ribbon or string to your mask to fasten it to your head.

## What you will need

- Card, cardboard or heavy weight paper for the mask
- Pencil to draw eye and mouth holes
- Ask your parent or guardian to cut out holes with scissors or a craft scalpel
- Felt tip pens, crayons or paint for base colour
- Pritt stick or PVA glue
- Felt pieces, glitter and spare paper for added decorations
- Ribbon or string to fasten mask to your head

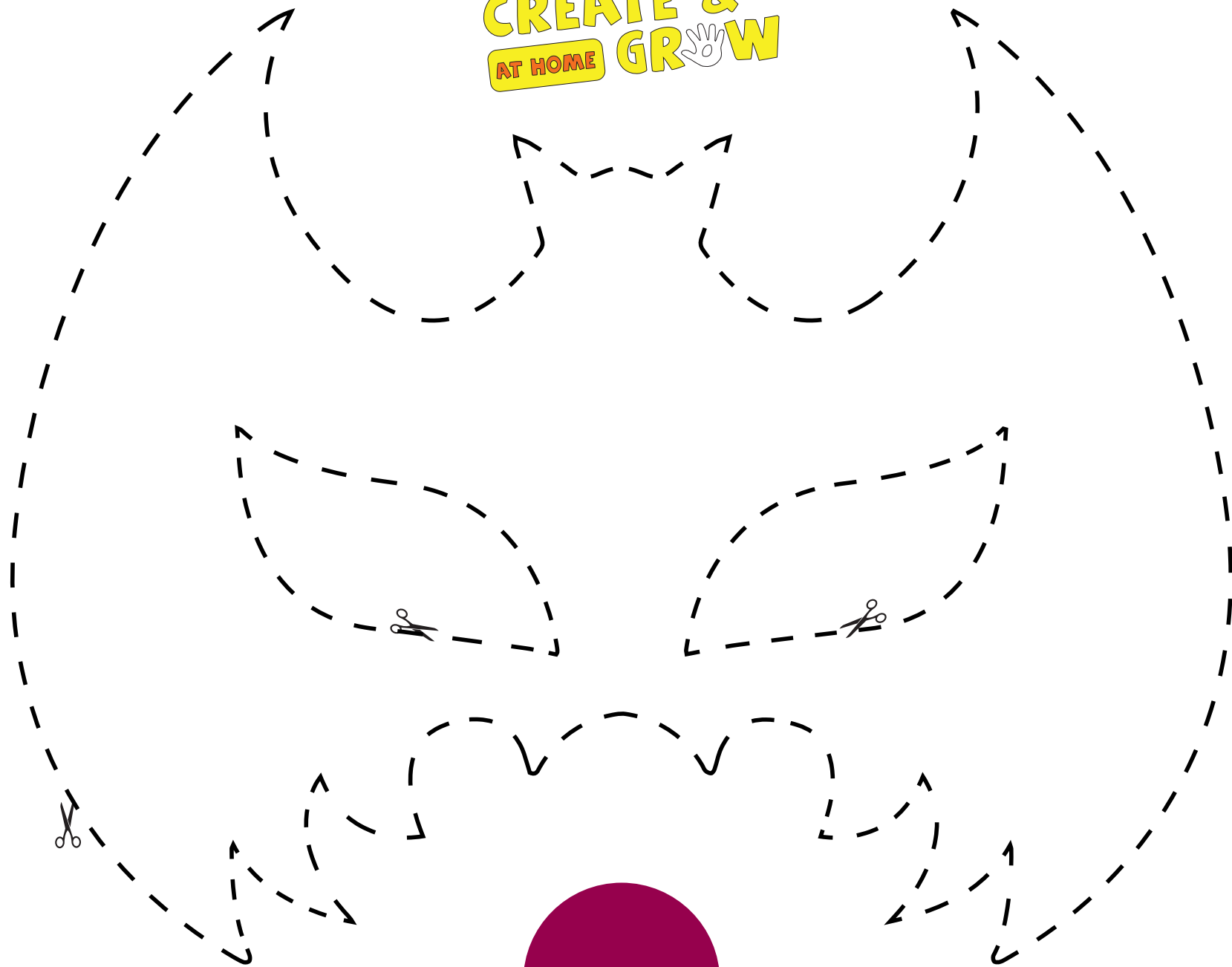
Frankenstein's Monster Mask
